


Pen Writing

There are still reporters writing this way.


They all use backup recorders.

- Similar to Morse Code.






Built In Recorders, Streaming, Bluetooth.

Speaking Rates

- Stenography is the human attempt to write everything down using machine shorthand.
- Average rate of speaking is 150-180 words per minute.
- Tony Robbins average 201 for TED talk.
- Auctioneers average 250 words per minute.
- The best stenographer in history can do 225 for less than five minutes with about 98% accuracy.
- All steno machines have built-in recording devices.



How Stenographers Create a Transcript

- Attend deposition and both write and record what is said.
- Send to Scopist to translate code.
- Send to Proofreader to fill in gaps with backup audio.
- Reporter review.
- Format and produce.

Voice Writers



History of Digital Reporting

- First used by Kentuckiana Reporters in 2008 thanks to Eastern KY.
- Faster turn-around time, ease of scheduling, lower prices, improved accuracy.
- Per page rate is lower today than 2010.
- Nationwide by 2014.
- Hundreds of proceedings per day, millions of pages per year.
- We cover 100-150 EUOs per day both in person and remote.
- Clients like Geico, USAA, State Farm, etc.

How a Digital Creates a Transcript

- Digital uses modern recording devices to capture best audio possible.
- Digital types transcript in standard shorthand.
- Transcript team/editors (sometimes with help of AI), merge shorthand and audio.
- Proofreaders review transcript with audio to ensure 100% accuracy.
- QC specialists spot check.
- Production team generates formatted transcript and index pages.

Stenography vs Digital Reporting

- Stenography was invented in the 1800's when recording devices did not exist. Back when we drove horses to work.
- Average age of stenographers in America is 57.
- Nationwide shortage stands around 6500 (Drucker Report).

- State of the art multichannel recording system.
- Digitals write in standard shorthand instead of phonetic shorthand.
- Average age is 25.
- Eliminating court reporting shortage.

You Bet Your Life

 Deposition is written in phonetic shorthand by a person who averages an 85-90% accuracy rate.

- Deposition recorded on modern multi-channel recording device.
- Video recorded.
- Written in standard shorthand.
- Live stream AI transcription

Barriers to Market Entry

 Stenographers claims that digital reporting is not permitted.

- Rule 30(b)(8)(B) specifically states that depositions may be taken non-stenographically.
- (A) Unless the court orders otherwise, testimony may be recorded by audio, audiovisual, or stenographic means, or any combination of those means. The noticing party bears the cost of the recording means specified in the notice

Stenographer Shortage

- Figures recently published by the Speech to Text Institute (STTI) calculate that the supply gap of stenographers will double in size to 11,345 by 2023, grow to 18,447 by 2028, and balloon to 23,117 by 2033. The number of stenographers nationally—once more than 50,000—will dwindle to 23,100 by 2023, 17,260 by 2028 and a mere 13,900 by 2033.
- The crux of the stenographer shortage is this—according to STTI's analysis, in each year for the next eight years, an average of 1,120 stenographers will retire, while no more than 200 new reporters will enter the workforce. This will reduce the number of stenographers by 920 annually at the same time that marketplace factors are likely to increase demand for court reporters.

California Data

- A report from the California Legislative Analyst's Office (March 5) that breaks down the pending shortage in California.
- In 2009-10, CA had 7,503 licensed reporters. By 2022-23, that number had dropped to 5,584. That is a decline of 1,919 reporters (26%) in only ten years. So, while the demand and pay for stenos went up, the supply dramatically decreased.
- They are facing a retirement time bomb. Of the 5,584 reporters they have left, 3,115 received their licenses at least 23 years ago. Indeed, 40% of reporters in CA self-reported that they are ten years or less from retirement. So, CA appears poised to lose 40-60% of their stenographers over the next ten years. Again, CA is one of the most desirable places for reporters to work in terms of pay and quality of life. As the shortage grows there, it will impact surrounding states when CA recruits their reporters. In other words, the future is even more bleak for other states who cannot financially compete with CA.
- Courthouses and SIUs hit the hardest.







